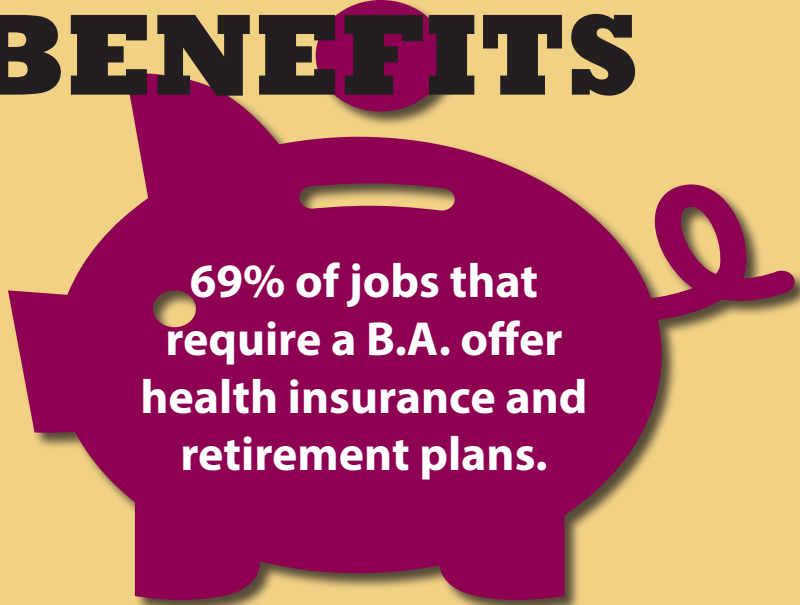
With a college degree you have more:

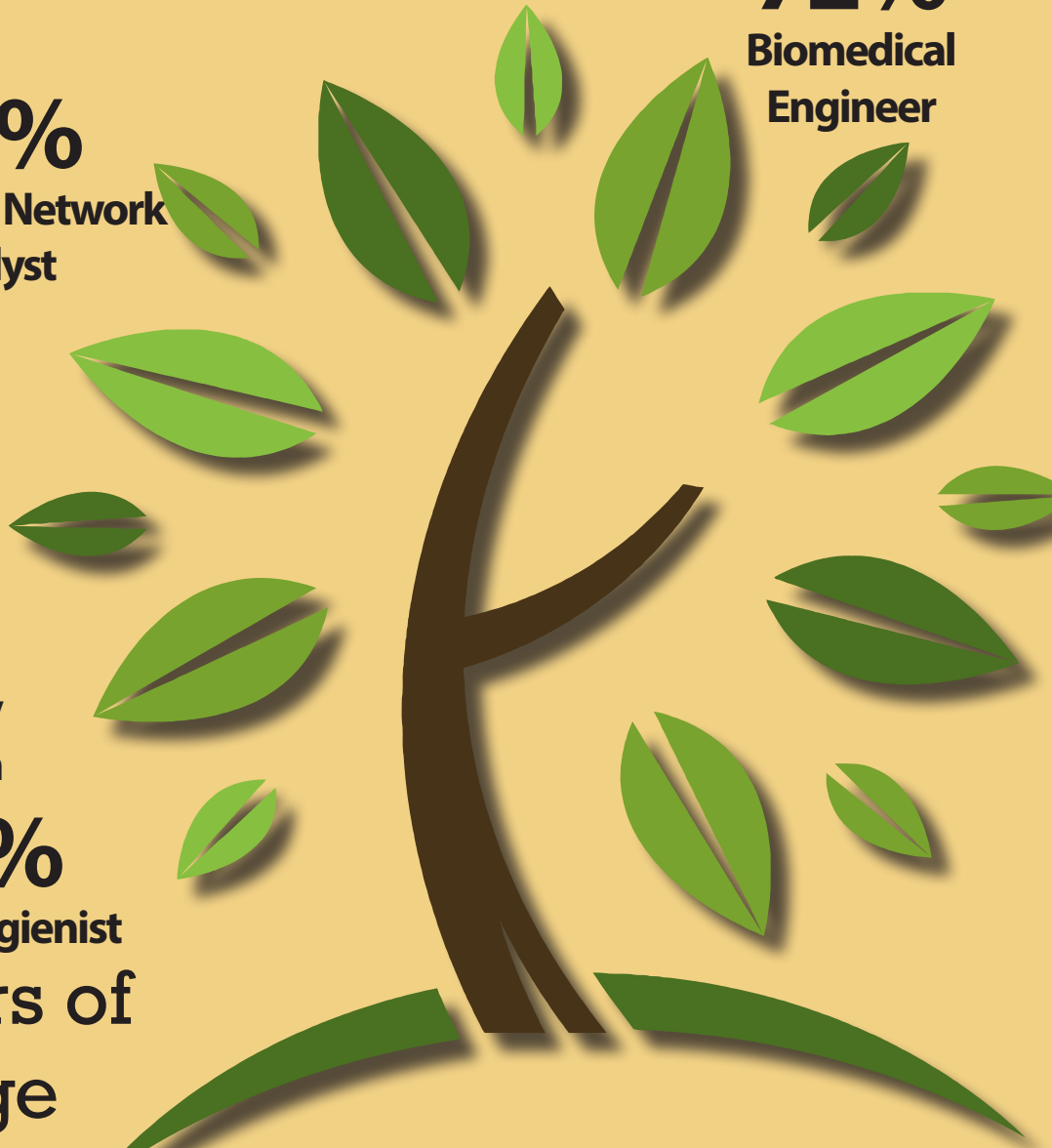

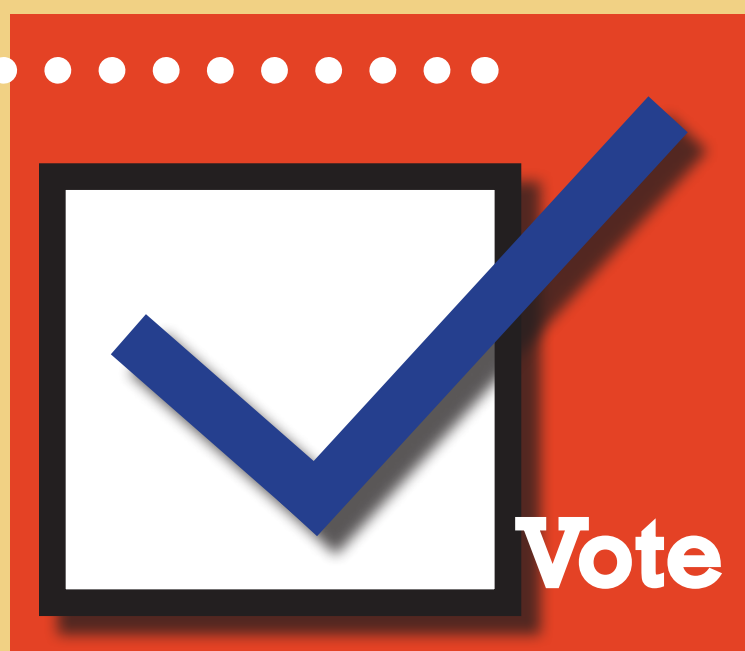
